

# Denton and Harlaxton CE Primary Schools

## Support for Parents with Paediatrics Referrals



If your child does not display behaviours in school, the school are unable to refer to the Paediatric pathway as they will not meet criteria for a neurodevelopment assessment due to the NHS's strict criteria.

Before a referral can be completed, we must follow the steps to gather evidence that the different strategies have been tried and tested. Referrals will not be accepted unless there is evidence of this.

### 3. Review with Class Teacher

Arrange a follow up meeting to review the strategies. This could include the SEND Team for further support and guidance. Continue to seek further training and continue the support for a further 6 weeks.



### 2. Speak to the Class Teacher

Share concerns and worries. Implement further strategies in school and at home. Monitor for a minimum of 6 weeks.

### 1. Home Environment

Implement strategies of support in the home and seek additional support through parent training opportunities (see Appendix 1).

### 4. Meet with the SEND Team

Discuss concerns with the SEND Team. They may be able to signpost further support and resources that might help. These strategies need to be consistent and tried over time to see benefits.

### 5. Follow up with SEND Team

If things are working, continue! If there are still difficulties, there may now be sufficient evidence for a referral to Paediatrics.
