



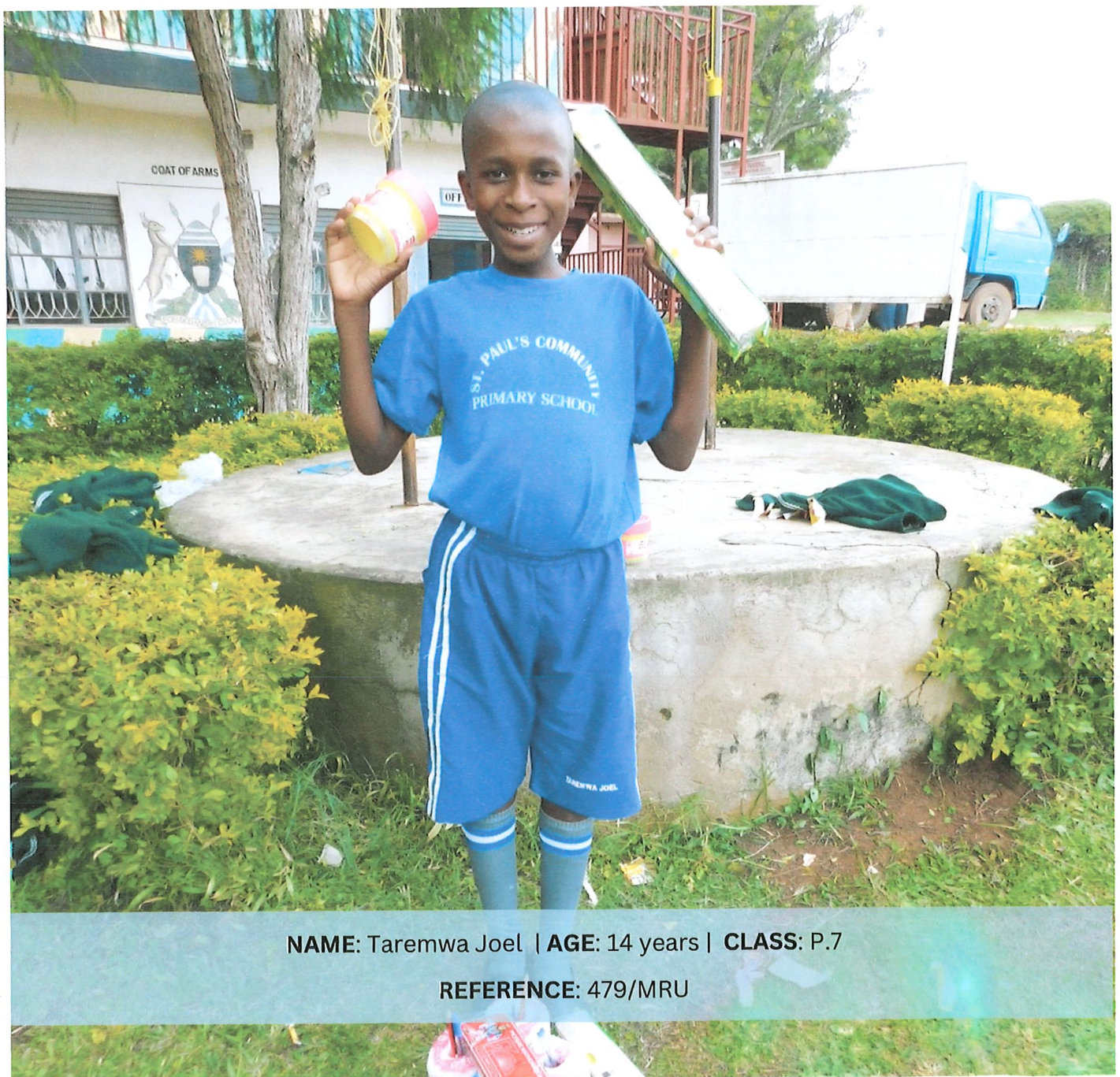
Christian Partners in Africa SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

He graduated to P.7 this year and he was happy and excited about it.

He is thankful for your support, and grateful to have his boarding school fees fully paid, along with the scholastic materials that he needs to help him to succeed. These include books, pens, a ream of paper, toilet paper, toothpaste, shoe polish, and a mathematical set.

Now that Joel is boarding, he has enough time to study hard. His favourite subjects are English and Science, which are taught to him by teachers Moreen and Amon.

In his free time Joel plays with his friends Moses and Joakim. At the weekends Joel plays football with his friends Owen and Timothy, and attends chapel. He wants to be a doctor after his studies.

During the holidays the project children attended a Centre Day run by the social workers, which they thoroughly enjoyed. They listened to Bible stories, sang and played games, and they learnt how to maintain their personal hygiene and wash their clothes. They were all given a soda and a snack and loved meeting up with their friends.

Joel, his siblings and their mum have moved to a much better permanent house. His dad still works for a company in Southern Sudan as a storekeeper. He often calls to speak to his family and sends money to ensure they are okay.

In December, Joel's mother, Lydia, harvested maize, sorghum and beans. She is now sun drying and harvesting coffee. Lydia now tries to earn by selling at the market, especially at festivals, including Easter and Christmas.

The piglet that the family received as a Gift of Love is growing and it is in the process of mating. They are hoping it will have some babies that can be sold.

Your love and care has helped Lydia so much. The family are very thankful.
